Our Values

"The Society of **Brownfield Risk** Assessment (SoBRA) has been established to support the growing number of professionals working in land contamination risk assessment... Its goals are to improve technical knowledge in risk-based decisionmaking related to land contamination applications and to enhance the professional status and profile of practitioners."

SoBRA's core objectives:

- To support technical excellence in the assessment, estimation & evaluation of risks and associated uncertainties from land affected by contaminants.
- To encourage "good practice" in the practical applications of risk assessment to support decisions regarding the appropriate management of land contamination.
- To facilitate and widen access to the dissemination of knowledge regarding land contamination risk assessment.
- 4. To form relationships and work in a constructive manner with other organisations and professional bodies involved in land contamination and remediation, as well as the environmental sciences in general.
- 5. To assist in the development of future guidance, either through coordinated responses to consultation documents or by providing direct input to guidance.
- To identify areas of future research that would benefit the assessment of land contamination.
- To co-ordinate and encourage such research and, where appropriate, explore funding arrangements to support it.

"SoBRA is a not-forprofit society. It is run on a voluntary basis, by a democratically elected committee. Membership is open to any individual who is involved in, or has an interest in, land contamination risk assessment."








Charitable Status
